









## MAP OF ENGLAND.

## ARKANSAS.

Name of Indian origin, signifying "land of the south," with prefix from French meaning "bow."

Settled at Arkansas Post by French, 1719; became a Territory, 1819; admitted as a State, 1836; seceded March 4, 1861; re-admitted 1868.

Area, 31,850 square miles; length, 300 miles; width, from 70 to 250 miles; elevation, 200 to 400 miles. Number counties, 75.

Temperature at Little Rock, winter, 32° to 52°; summer, 70° to 82°; rainfall, at Fort Smith, 55 in.; at Little Rock, 45 in.; at Washington, 55 in.

Hot Springs, in Garland County, 50° to 90°. Soil suitable for valuable medicinal springs; temperature of water, 60° to 80°. Little Rock, the capital and metropolis; population, 188,000.

Number farms, 24,633; per acre, cleared land, \$11.76; woodland, \$11.49.

Corn crop, 1854, 24,468 bushels; cotton, 515,000 bushels; tobacco crop, 1,904,672 pounds; oats, 2,500,000 bushels; potatoes, 10,200 bushels. Banks sixth largest in nation, total assets, \$26,000,000.

Salaries in 1884, \$2,372,947, or about \$2,167 per annum.

Governor, \$1,200; Lt. Governor, \$1,000; Attorney General, \$1,000; Auditor, \$1,000; State Geologist, \$1,000; Commissioner of Education, \$1,000; Commissioner of Agriculture, \$1,000; Commissioner of Insurance, \$1,000; Commissioner of Banks, \$1,000; Commissioner of Forestry, \$1,000.

Rivers, Arkansas, Mississippi, White, Illinois, Cache, St. Francis, Arkansas; lakes, Lake Texoma, Lake O' the Pines, Lake Ouachita; elevation above sea level, 200 to 500 feet.

Climate, semi-tropical in southern part; average annual temperature, 60°; average annual rainfall, 45 in.; average annual snowfall, 10 in.

Religion, Protestant 70%; Roman Catholic 20%; others 10%.

Government, state, county, city, town, school, church, corporation, club, society, etc., all organized.

Parks, State, 20,000 acres; State Parks, 10,000 acres; State Forest, 100,000 acres.


